- Children's social care programmes.




22 Where We Fit In!

22 UK Prisons & Young People

- The UK prison system currently holds a national population of approximately **86**, **327** prisoners
- 0.8% of the prison population are aged under 18

Of which:

- 649 young people are currently held in prisons
- 172 young people are held in Secure Training Centres
- 110 as part of Looked After Care Orders

22 The Catch22 Approach

- Once Caseworker, One Assessment, One Relationship Relational Continuity
- Catch22 staff are non-uniformed and are civilian workers

 Not Prison Officers
- Focus on building a high quality relationships and trust through our resettlement role
- Act as a conduit and balance between prisoner disclosures and security intelligence
- Deliver support and interventions as part of a constructive regime
- Transition to Adulthood Models juveniles that become young adult offenders whilst serving a sentence in prison





HMP Thameside in London



22 HMP Thameside

- Opened in 2012 as London's first privately operated prison.
- Local Security Category B prison in Greenwich, South East London.
- Operational Capacity of 1232 young adult & adult males 18+
- 350 new receptions per month.
- Releases around 150 sentenced prisoners a month (60% of which served less than 12 weeks).



22 A New Prison

- When HMP Thameside opened it was populated rapidly with a mix of inner London prisoners from other prisons and newly sentenced people including a high proportion of gang members.
- Prison Officers were newly trained, processes still being established and the regime and security protocols were still being formed and embedded.
- Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Prisons visited in January 2013 finding high levels of violent assaults, 1600 in Year 1, of which 38% were found to be gang related.
- Catch22 were asked to design and introduce a service within HMP Thameside to address these issues working alongside our Offender Management and Resettlement Teams.
- Since the service was introduced in HMP Thameside 2013 Peer on peer violence rate per 1000 committed by gang involved prisoners reduced by 50%. This was been achieved through providing focused Gangs Worker support, conflict resolution and mediation sessions between gang associated individuals.
